Guest Speakers - August 22, 2019 - 3rd Q Chapter Meeting



Bob "Coach" Henriquez is deeply rooted to the community he serves. A fifth-generation resident of Tampa, Bob was born and raised in that city and his great grandfather, Enrique Henriquez, was the last mayor of West Tampa before it was annexed into the City of Tampa in 1925. Guided by working-class parents devoted to him and his three siblings, Bob has been driven by a desire to help those around him. He built the foundation for that goal by achieving academic success at Tampa Catholic High and Princeton University. At both schools, Bob learned the importance of teamwork as a starting offensive lineman on the football squads.

Soon after graduating from Princeton, Bob went to work for Hillsborough County's Streets & Addresses department to help enhance its 9-1-1 program. Later he joined the county's Planning Commission to assist in growth management. In 1998, Bob followed his ambitions to serve his community to a new level when he was elected to the Florida Legislature as a State Representative. There, he developed a reputation as a legislator eager to put aside party politics for the good of his constituents. After four terms in office, Bob was appointed to head up the Pinellas and Pasco counties division of the Department of Children and Families. He served in that role for three years.

Interwoven with Bob's public service has been his tireless work molding the lives of young men as a football coach. Bob served two stints as head coach at Tampa Catholic, from 1990-99 and again from 2005-2012. In 2007, TC reached the state championship game for the first time in school history and the Crusaders returned to that stage in 2009. During his tenure at TC, Bob's teams compiled a record of a 128-71, reached the playoffs 13 times and won seven district crowns. Bob also served as an assistant coach at Jefferson High. After winning the election of Hillsborough County Property Appraiser in 2012, Bob made the decision to step down as head coach at TC in order to focus his energies on the constitutional responsibilities of his office. He now leads a new "team" with his same ambitions: to serve the public with fairness, professionalism and humility.

Mike Twitty, MAI, was sworn into office on January 3, 2017 as the Pinellas County Property Appraiser. Prior to being elected he was a senior managing director and principal of a successful residential and commercial appraisal firm based in Pinellas County. Mike is a lifelong resident of Pinellas County. After graduation from Largo High School he received a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration at the University of Florida in 1989, where he majored in Real Estate & Urban Analysis. He subsequently received his Florida Real Estate Broker's license, State-Certified General Real Estate Appraisal certification, was awarded the MAI designation from the Appraisal Institute and received the Certified Florida Appraiser designation from the Florida Department of Revenue.

Mike has over 28 years of experience in the valuation of a wide variety of property types within Pinellas County and is presently a Director of the Gulf Coast Chapter of the Appraisal Institute. He has qualified as an expert witness in five area counties relating to real estate valuation matters and has substantial experience in evaluating and solving difficult valuation assignments. He has also been involved in real estate technology throughout his career. He served as a key member of a technology taskforce formed to tackle difficult real-world issues surrounding the design, maintenance and deployment of appraisal report templates on a national scale. Mike presently serves as Chairman of Pinellas County Enterprise GIS (eGIS), is a member of the Legislative Committee for the Property Appraiser's Association of Florida (PAAF) and Chairman of PAAF's Florida Flood Impact Committee, which tracks National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) legislative activity and potential value impacts due to rising premiums. Mike's personal life is defined by his love of family, friends and music. He has a musical family with both of his sons and himself being musicians and playing different instruments (guitar, piano, percussion, bassoon and vocals). Mike is also an avid sportsmen (boating, fishing and scuba diving) and is a licensed private pilot. Mike resides with his wife Michele and their two sons in the Largo area. Mike also lends his time and talents to many charitable causes and has been active in the community as a youth coach at West Pinellas Little League, the City of Largo and the Town of Belleair.

Government Relations Report, by Devon Carter, MAI

The attorney for FREAB indicated that evaluations are outside the jurisdiction of the board as it stands. FREAB can put in standards for evaluations; however, none have been; therefore, anyone can write one - appraiser or not. Recall, it was at question whether or not certified appraisers could perform evaluations outside of US-PAP. At the last meeting, it was decided that, we as appraisers, can perform evaluations. In my experience talking with other appraisers who perform evaluations, we are still adhering to USPAP requirements, at least to the level of a restricted appraisal report.

The National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) quadrupled the appraisal threshold for nonresidential real estate loans from \$250,000 to \$1,000,000. This would effectively exempt up to 66% of loans, up from about 27%. Since the Federal Reserve upped the threshold from \$250,000 to \$500,000 just last year, the NCUA's action could have a similar reaction with the Feds. This is all in the name of "regulatory relief;" however, this could have far reaching effects with loans secured with un-appraised real estate as collateral.


Mike Twitty forwarded some information along in regard to protected addresses. Florida Statue 119.071 has been amended to expand information from public record. Previously, if you were researching a property and the owner came up "confidential," you were unable to see the owner's name. As of July 1, the term "home address" has been expanded to include much more information including: physical and mailing address, parcel ID, neighborhood name and lot number, legal description, GPS coordinates and any other descriptive property information. Even if you have the parcel ID, the parcel will not be viewable. I have tested this in Hillsborough County, and clicking on a known "confidential" property brings up a blank information screen. If your subject property is under "confidential" ownership, it will require securing a notarized authorization for release of information, which will likely increase the amount of time required in preparing an appraisal.






for 6 hours of CE, instead of 4.

LDAC 2019 Overview

Tim Sunyog, MAI (1st Year), Mike Twitty, MAI (1st Year) and I (Byron Torres, MAI) attended the Leadership Development and Advisory Council (LDAC) conference, held from May 15-17 in Washington, DC. We participated in four discussion sessions and went to Capitol Hill to lobby appraisal regulatory modernization and housing finance reform with our representatives in the House and Senate.

The discussion sessions were moderated by Erik Hanson, MAI, Lisa Meinczinger, SRA, AI-RRS, Rob Moorman, MAI, SRA, AI-GRS and Eric Schneider, MAI, SRA, AI-GRS. Below are the discussion topics and several key points discussed in each session.

How do we set ourselves apart and message effectively to clients (the appraiser and the appraisal)?

- Superior education
- Verification of 3rd party data
- Al providing an appraisal review service

Increasing thresholds, alternative products, waivers: How can AI help appraisers adapt to the new environment and position our members to be at the front of the line?

- Education/Communication/Podcasts
- Lobby to change USPAP to help appraisers be competitive
- Possible business opportunity for appraisers to complete inspections as 3rd party inspectors

Al Education: what is the best way to deliver it? How do we capture more? What are we doing well? What can we do better?

- Online classes and a day in class for Q&A
- Short videos discussing educational topics
- Subscription package for CE/QE/Designation paths
- AI App/Podcast
- More coordination with National & Chapters

How can chapters maximize value to members?

- Communicate with other chapters when offering classes
- National helping to organize classes throughout the regions
- Welcoming committee for new members

We discussed similar topics with our representatives in Washington DC, as we did with our representatives in Tallahassee for the VALUEvent. The topics covered were the current threshold and appraisal regulatory modernization. We have requested the House of Representatives and Senate to consider our topics in any reform legislation.

Region X Meeting and National Updates

Region X Meeting

The Region X Meeting on July 21st was well attended ahead of the Annual Conference. The Region Chair, Nicholas D. Pilz, MAI, SRA, AI-RRS and Vice Chair Elaine Liz-Ramirez, MAI presided over the meeting. The Region approved the prior minutes, discussed the finance report, government relations update, university relations update, officer reports, and chapter presidents' updates. The Florida Law update for 2020 and the 45-day notice were also discussed. The most important announcement was the decision on the 2020 incoming 3rd Director position. Reginald M. Carter, MAI, SRA, of the Northeast Florida Chapter, will represent Region X as 3rd Director in 2020, Vice Chair in 2021-2022, and Chair in 2023-2024. Congratulations to Reggie as the incoming 3rd Director for Region X!

National Conference

The Annual Conference kicked off with an inspirational keynote speaker, Allison Massari. Those of us there felt the overwhelming power of her message and the strength that comes from within. Her message was one of will, power of the mind, and the ability to forgive and love. It was an extremely moving start to a fantastic schedule of events throughout the conference. There were over 525 attendees, and the seminars covered an array of topics, which were well attended by residential and commercial appraisers during our three days in Denver. There were additional events available to attend, including an off-site reception at Coors Field, a women's initiative breakfast, the President's Gala Cocktail Reception and Dinner, and the awards luncheon sponsored by the Al Education and Relief Foundation. In total, there were 11 awards given out to very deserving members and contributors to our profession!

National AI Update

I wanted to share a few of the updates from the information presented by the National Officers.

- As I mentioned earlier this year, the Appraisal Institute will be replacing its Association Management System (AMS) with a new system to be known as "netFORUM", which is now expected to begin implementation on October 1st, 2019. The AMS is an online membership database and customer relations management software platform. The current AMS interfaces with over 30 different systems and is the foundation for almost every service and product that AI offers. With the new AMS (netFORUM), AI professionals, students, customers and staff will enjoy benefits such as: Increased user accessibility to data; Improved business processes and efficiencies; Integrated web experience; and Self-service capabilities that will make interactions with AI simpler and more convenient. Additionally, the My Account area of the AI website will be completely new, including improvements to: Education search and registration; Online store; Membership profile; FAA profile; Self Service; Printing a transcript; Paying dues/fees; Candidate checklist; Volunteer information.
 - Please note that all software launches involve some short-term inconvenience: Password resets will be needed after the new AMS goes live (training video to be released); AI Professionals will be unable to transact with many areas of the AI website from September 26th 30th.
 - For 2020 education offerings and events, due to the transition, opening registration will not be available until after the 'go live' date of October 1st.
 - Registration for offerings scheduled until December 31st will remain open.
 - Remember to look for future communications from AI on this topic as the launch date approach es!

Region X Meeting and National Updates Continued

• Board actions including the 45-Day Notice, Amendments to Bylaws and Regulations 8, 9 and 10, Certificate of Completion, and Courses requirement. The Courses requirement was of particular interest as it amended the policy for the courses requirement for General Candidates by removing the requirement to take and pass "General Appraiser Report Writing and Case Studies." Additionally, there was a Chapter merger of the Memphis Chapter and the Greater Tennessee Chapter, which will be known as the Tennessee Chapter of the Appraisal Institute.

- •The 2020 General Demonstration Capstone Schedule is currently being planned. There will be four Classroom offerings and two Synchronous offerings. (NOTE: Although AI expects to release information about the dates and locations for the Capstone programs in late summer, registration for the Capstone will NOT open until AFTER the new AMS "netFORUM" goes live in October.)
- Candidates please be aware of the next scholarship deadline of October 1st for:
 - AIERF Minorities and Women AI Course Scholarship Open to minorities and women Candidates for Designation who are active in appraising and need financial assistance to take an Appraisal Institute course leading to the MAI, SRA, AI-GRS or AI-RRS designations.
 - AIERF AI Course Scholarship Open to all Candidates for Designation who are active in appraising and need financial assistance to take an Appraisal Institute course leading to the MAI, SRA, AI-GRS or AI-RRS designations.
- Practicing Affiliates the AI Education and Relief Foundation has announced a new scholarship for you:
 - The scholarship will cover a course needed for state certification; there will be one scholarship from AIERF per year; the first deadline is October 1st, 2019. Visit AIERF.org to learn more and apply for these scholarship options!
- The Appraisal Standards Board of The Appraisal Foundation adopted the 2020-21 edition of USPAP. Changes to USPAP include:
 - O Permitting additional intended users for Restricted Appraisal Reports
 - O Significantly reducing the number Comments to Standards Rules and Definitions
 - Please note: One of the ways that the ASB reduced the number of Comments was by moving requirements from Comments to new or existing Standards Rules so the 2020-21 edition of USPAP will include several new Standards Rules.
 - O Adding definitions of "assignment elements", "effective date", "misleading", "personal inspection", "physical characteristics", and "relevant characteristics."
 - O A detailed description of changes that have been adopted for the 2020-21 edition of USPAP can be accessed through a link on the Standards of Professional Practice page of the Appraisal Institute website or on the Appraisal Foundation website.
- Lastly, just a reminder that the **2020 Appraisal Institute National Conference will be held in Orlando!** We will provide updates as more information becomes available.

Government Relations

AI Condemns National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) Action on Appraisal Thresholds

- O The NCUA Board of Directors quadrupled from \$250,000 to \$1 million the appraisal threshold for nonresidential real estate loans.
- OThe Appraisal Institute, on July 19th, vigorously condemned action by the National Credit Union Administration, calling the NCUA's decision to effectively reduce the number of appraisals required for commercial real estate loans irresponsible, radical and dangerous. The organization further called for congressional oversight.
- O Another concern is with the NCUA's new threshold, there will be pressure on the federal bank regulatory agencies to follow suit, which is possible considering the competition in the market. Overall, there could be a much larger impact to appraisal requirements for lenders that only order appraisals based on the required threshold levels. It is noted that lenders may still to choose to order an appraisal below the minimum thresholds for sound business practices. However, with the increase to the threshold for credit unions, other federal bank regulatory agencies will have greater pressure to follow suit, which will equate to appraisal request decreases.

National Residential Round Table Event

The event was conceived by a small group of very savvy Appraisal Institute members, including one of our very own — Jennifer Marshall, SRA, AI-RRS. Bay County Special Magistrates

The Value Adjustment Board in and for Bay County Florida is currently seeking individuals interested in serving as Special Magistrates to the 2019 Value Adjustment Board. Special Magistrates are appointed for the purpose of taking testimony and making recommendations to the Board. Special Magistrates cannot be elected or appointed officials or employees of the county. Employees and elected or appointed officials of a taxing jurisdiction or of the state may not serve as Special Magistrates.

A Special Magistrate appointed to hear issues regarding valuation of real estate shall be a state certified real estate appraiser with not less than 5 years' experience in real property valuation and meet the requirements of Section 194.035 F.S and Section 12D-9.010 FAC. During term of service, the Special Magistrate cannot represent any party before the Board.

A Special Magistrate appointed to hear issues regarding valuation of tangible personal property must have at least 5 years' experience in tangible personal property valuation and shall be a designated member of a nationally recognized appraiser's organization. During term of service, the Special Magistrate cannot represent any party before the Board.

A Special Magistrate need not be a resident of the county for appointment. If required by law, Special Magistrates shall obtain the Department of Revenue training certificate for Special Magistrates and provide verification of such qualifications and training to the Clerk of the Board.

Candidates: Your Annual Minimum Progress is shown in the form of a graph on our MY AI ACCOUNT page. The chart is located in the right-hand column, and the display shows how many requirements you must complete (blue bar) and how many requirements you have already completed (gold bar). Check your <u>Candidate Status Report</u> for a list of remaining designation requirements. Candidates must ensure you are meeting your annual progress requirements. If you have not met minimum designation progress, you risk losing credit for the requirements previously completed.

2019 Capstone Program— for the candidates seeking the MAI designation, please note that the General Demonstration Report—Capstone Program—will be offered in just a few locations this year. The 2020 Capstone schedule will be announced in the third quarter. For more information on the Capstone Program and the other options, there is a new Capstone page online, which makes it easy to see the schedules, registration deadlines, etc. <u>Click Here</u>.

Experience Requirements—The purpose of the Appraisal Institute Experience Requirements is to determine if a Candidate for Designations work meets the requirements specified in applicable AI Regulations, Policies, and Procedures, including Significant Professional Responsibility, Reasonable Relationship of Hours, and the <u>Appraisal Institute Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice</u> (or other relevant criteria). Candidates should be open to listening to and exchanging information with the Experience Screener. The Experience Requirement and interview is a learning process, whether or not your credit is approved. You likely will come away with new ideas for reporting and possibly a better understanding of theory and techniques.

Reports must be submitted in their entirety, which means that the report is to be submitted just as it was sent to the client. Reports are not to be edited or altered in any way for the experience process. All work for which experience is claimed must have been performed for a business purpose (mock experience and mock review experience is ineligible).

We currently have 38 candidates for designation and 3 members seeking the review designation. We ask that our designated members and candidates encourage any non-designated appraisers to consider getting any AI designation and contact the Candidate Guidance Committee if we can answer any questions they may have and/or explain the many benefits of Appraisal Institute affiliation and designation.

Candidates for Designation

CE Requirements

Candidates and Practicing Affiliates must complete 70 hours (350 points) of continuing education for every five-year cycle. Designated members must complete 100 hours (500 points) of CE every 5-year cycle. The points system offers an incentive to individuals who attend advanced education. Al will now reward individuals who take and pass exams. The system's tiered point structure allocates higher point values to courses and seminars defined as advanced education. For more information, visit the Al website.

Generally, 1 hour of CE = 5 points (1% of 500 points) or more. This formula is also used for education taken outside of AI, which members can add on their own by logging onto the website and clicking: Add Credit to My AI CE Log. USPAP and Business Practice & Ethics are each valued at 35 points.

- November 1 - 30, 2019 (The recommended apply by date is September 20, 2019)

The Appraisal Institute Testified at House Subcommittee Hearing in June

Al President Stephen Wagner, MAI, SRA, Al=GRS testified on June 20th to the House Financial Services Committee's Housing, Community Development and Insurance Subcommittee, on a range of residential appraiser concerns and expressing support for two bills pending before the Committee.

H.R. 2852 - would allow licensed appraisers to perform appraisals for Federal Housing Administration loans and would reaffirm verifiable education requirements for FHA appraisers. The second Bill is a discussion draft from Rep. Lacy Clay, D-Mo, would give greater flexibility to registry fees assessed by the Appraisal Subcommittee and would require separate disclosure of AMC fees to consumers. <u>Learn more</u> about the AI testimony.

Appraisal Institute Condemns NCUA's Action, Calls for Congressional Oversight

The Appraisal Institute on July 18 condemned as irresponsible and dangerous the National Credit Union Administration's decision to increase the appraisal threshold for nonresidential real estate loans from \$250,000 to \$1 million, effectively reducing the number of appraisals required for commercial loans and challenging the safety and soundness of the system.
